PP Boh carried out Part 2 of his vocational service talk by displaying a video presentation on the Smart Tunnel construction. This was KL's solution to flooding – a 9.7km long 3-layer tunnel built only 20m below the surface of Kuala Lumpur. With two traffic layers (which could also be set aside for water if necessary) and one floodwater later, this tunnel was over 13m wide and took almost 3 years to build.

While watching the video, PP Boh commented on what we were seeing, giving us his opinion and some of his personal experiences during his involvement in the building of the Smart Tunnel. He explained about the complexities involved in building the tunnel, and the issues he was called in to resolve. His comments throughout the video enhanced our knowledge of the geographical challenges faced by the builders, the safety features implemented and the intricacies of the tunnel building machines and other equipment used during construction.

No doubt many of us have driven through the Smart tunnel, but very few of us will have recognised or understood the constructional marvel that it is, and the deep layers of geology, construction and technology that have come together to build this combined flood/traffic tunnel.
